Please be aware of all the handling that these boxes require when they are sent to a zone show and perhaps onward to be handled again at the Alberta Wide Show. If you are an award recipient, they are shipped to Edmonton to the Visual Arts Alberta Show. Many people have to unpack and repack your boxes so please realize this and make them as easy to handle and open as possible.

Here is a comment made about boxes from the Central Zone show:”

“Most of the boxes were fine – but there were TOO BIG BOXES, BOXES WHICH WERE TAPED, BOXES THAT DIDN’T HAVE ADEQUATE LABELING.

We were probably a little soft in accepting some of them – in which case – we prevented “logical consequences.” For those saintly members like Sue, Carol and Terry (from Innisfail area) who brought in other member’s works in order to save on time and gas – they were the messengers who we couldn’t shoot – they were the saints!!! They had to do the changes required for those members who didn’t comply for whatever reason.


And please, tell them next year not to use boxes that had ‘lounge chairs’ inside and still looked like they still had lounge chairs inside. All the graphics confused the information needed by the volunteers in order to check the works in.

The Art of Associating by Trish Acres

Thirty dollars definitely won't get my husband and me a nice meal in a restaurant. In fact I can't even buy a pair of shoes for thirty bucks. Maybe that is why I have a hard time believing that I can enter recent paintings into a juried exhibition, attend workshops and paint outs, or apply for art related scholarships for an annual fee of only \$30 with the ACACA. AND they send you a newsletter with details of what they are up to.

Stated on their website, the ACACA (Alberta Community Art Clubs Association) aims at uniting, serving and networking with artists throughout the province. The province is divided into three sections; the southern, central and northern zones. Each zone hosts a juried exhibition of work within categories and each piece is open to awards. As a recent member of the ACACA and entrant of the Central Zone show, I've learned the finer details of how they work and what they offer. For this article though, I'd rather jump right into what I have *enjoyed* so far from this association.

As a developing artist, painting is a reflection of how I see the world. The way colour speaks to me, the way objects of landscapes grab my attention. I love looking at the work of other creative's for the same reason. Looking at paintings finished by another artist gives me a glimpse of the world through their eyes. I can enjoy what they see and what cries for their artistic attention. This is both an enjoyable and creative process. It can spark thoughts, memories or new artistic ideas. That alone is well worth the trip to one of the zone shows, even if you haven't submitted any work.

Artists can be a crazy bunch of people. They're often introverted with a unique appreciation for life. Okay, maybe I'm really just talking about myself here, but at both the Central zone show held in Sherwood Park, and the Alberta Wide Show in Red Deer, I had the opportunity to meet a couple of wonderful artists. The ACACA offers this unique opportunity to connect with other like-minded creative's. It allows us the venue to talk about the technical details of art and personal accomplishments. It's just another aspect of the association that may seem intimidating but can be very rewarding. I look forward to the continuation of budding friendships made at these events.

Finally, I definitely enjoyed the critiques offered at both shows that I attended. I eagerly took notes into my iPhone and felt like I was hanging on every word that was spoken. The jurors are highly educated individuals who spend their days submersed in the art world. How could I not want to soak in their suggestions? Listening to the critique with an open and non-defensive mind, I came home with more creative energy, insight and tools to better my following pieces. Just another perk to my thirty dollar registrations fee.

Not a member of the ACACA? Why not? It's very affordable..with plenty of opportunity to show your work..in an environment that aims to unite you with fellow creative's..and the encouragement to keep you painting to your full potential. I look forward to seeing you there next year and by the sounds of things, the ACACA is hosting a weekend symposium with even MORE AVAILABLE TO THEIR MEMBERS! Past-President/VAAA Rep. Barbara Carson's letter to Visual Arts Alberta Association



Greetings from the Alberta Community Art Clubs Association. We want to thank the VAAA for their continued support and interest in the ACACA and for being the umbrella organization for our funding. As the ACACA is one of the three remaining founding members of the Visual Arts Alberta Association, I am here to report our status and activities for the past year.

We represent 26 Clubs and 230 Individual members.

Three juried Zone Shows are held annual and this year were held in Hinton, Sherwood Park and Oyen Alberta, in May and Early June **at cost of \$600 per show.**

The Alberta Wide, "Spirit of Alberta" juried show followed at the Red Deer Museum & Art Gallery with the delivery of works, unpacking, jurying and repacking done on June 12th. The show opened on June 19th and ran until August 7th. The awards Ceremony and the AGM took place the same day, followed by the release of the paintings to the artists, with the winners of all three shows being transported to the VAAA Gallery here.

The "Alberta Spirit" Show here at the VAAA Gallery, opened on August 25 with the Grand Opening on September 8th., which was very well attended, and will close on October 1st., with a demonstration of digital art, by members of the ACACA.

Annually the ACACA offers its members, **three Individual Workshop Grant of \$400, 12 Club Workshop Grants of \$400, and 12 Executive Workshop Grants of \$400.**

We offer our 16 Juror's per year a \$300 honorarium each plus travel and accommodations.

Zone Show Award with certificates amount to \$250 per year, and the Alberta Wide Awards come to \$925. We also purchase the Winner of the President's Award for an additional \$500. It then becomes part of our Permanent Collection.

Administration and executive travel and accommodations for meetings and shows are also paid for.

This year there were 5 recipients of the Lillian Nunn Scholarship, which is administrated through the U of A Extensions Branch.

The symposium, were planning for 2012, has fallen through because we couldn't find corporate funding or commitment from enough of our members.

We have two sources of income, a **casino** out of the Red Deer provincial wide pool (which is not guaranteed and has conditions) and the **VAAA grant through the Alberta Foundation for the Arts.**

Our Executive voted last year to cut the Executive Workshop grants until funding was more secure. **If our funding is not increased we will be forced to cut more of our programming.**

So over the last 4 years ACACA may look a little different. But it is still your Association for you to enjoy. Be sure to participate in the Zones Shows, The AB Wide and the VAAA Winners show, where ALL the winners from Zone Shows and AB Wide are displayed.

To all our ACACA Clubs that host Zone Shows, Thank You. I think that all the clubs should try to spread the ACACA information to all their members as well as the communities. Have our brochures at all your art shows and classes. Remember that a member club can apply for a workshop grant each year which can be very helpful if you want to bring in an artist extraordinaire or go on a great adventure for a paint-out.

Participation is essential in any group. As a member of the ACACA it would be beneficial for all our members to challenge themselves and volunteer to be on the board.. It is a great learning experience and you meet so many nice people. New ideas are always good.

I am sure that the new ACACA Board will do a great job and I wish them all the best in their new positions.

Individual Workshop Grant Margi Matkea

I am very thankful to the ACACA for picking me as one of the recipients of the Individual Workshop Grant.

I was surprised to receive the news, affording me the opportunity to further my art studies. I was interested in checking out the Summer Series Acrylic class at Red Deer College

After checking the classes available, I was impressed to take “Foundations in Drawing Level 1”, which turned out to be the right choice for me as a short time after applying, I fell and broke my painting wrist and needed pins in. I wondered if I would still be able to take the class.

Working on therapy..come July class time, off I went.

I learned: how to work bigger & why, the importance to stand at an easel to draw and experienced Live Model Drawing for the first time. We progressed from Blind Contour to Modified, Gesture, Shapes, Shadows, Edges, Values, Negative Space, exploring Charcoal, Conte, the tools to use, Portrait Drawing, Perspective and the Principles of Design along with good teaching that truly did expand my horizons.

I would highly recommend others to apply for the grant that helps to get artists to quality instructors so we can develop our skills and to meet and learn with other artists. So inspiring and encouraging.

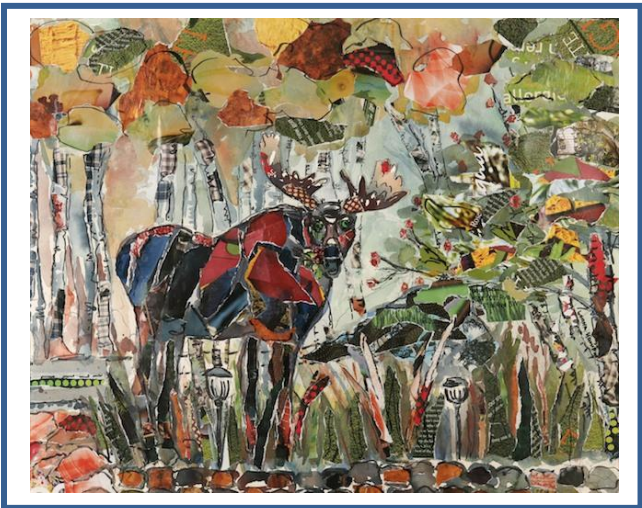

If you're painting a fall scene, Cadmium Yellow Deep should be your best friend.

Painting Secrets #39

1. FOCAL POINT: Choose one! The hardest part about painting is the vast buffet of visual stimuli Mother Nature puts out before you. Whether you are outdoors, painting a still life or using a photo you need to simplify things so you don't get overwhelmed. If you are getting confused then most certainly the viewer will be confused. If you start by saying “my painting is about the barn and the cows and the tree, oh and for sure the puffy cloud and the fence... too much information!!!! **Think- is my painting going to be about the foreground, the middle ground or the background/ sky.** One of these needs to be dominant and be a dominant shape.

2. SKETCHES: Keep making them until there's a good composition with leading lines in to focal point. A bad composition can only lead to a bad painting. Think thumbnails. Thumbnails should be just that; a simple small sketch with just the bare bones of info to set you up for the ka-powie painting you want. Try using a black sharpie marker to simplify your thumb nail sketches.

3. SQUINT! To see values, simplify. Even if you're using a photo, I know you'll look like your mother trying to read the white pages but I swear it works. Half close your eyes and look at what your painting (your topic) - that's the look you should be going for. Just don't squint when you look at your painting or you'll have a slurried mess.

4. COLOR KEY: Decide: Will the painting be predominantly Warm or Cool, High key or Low key, Predominant hue? No fence sitters here please. **Make it really lean to one side or the other.** One great way to tell if you're on the right track is to step back and have a look at your palette. If it has a predominant temperature to it or one hue colour is over most of the surface, Bobs your uncle. If you can't see dominance in the palette then I would bet my morning donut you don't have one on your painting.

5. CANVAS: Transpose thumbnail to canvas, creating large puzzle piece shapes. You should have no more than five different sized shapes in your initial set up.

6. UNDERPAINT: Loose, sketchy monochrome under painting of shapes, darks, and mid tones with very diluted paint. This will set up your values. If it looks good in a monochrome and you don't screw up, and follow your values: Roberts your Mothers Brother! Remember just because its dark doesn't mean it's black.

7. PAINT LARGE SHAPES: Match the value in your underpainting in a colour again by squinting you will see the match.

8. COLOUR PATCHES: Break larger shapes of matched colour into smaller patches of colour and light, matching or slightly exaggerating the colour. Try using a bigger brush than you would expect. A great way to not get too over detailed is to use a brush one size bigger than you think you need. Small brushes can make itty-bitty marks and itty-bitty marks can cause too much noise (detail) in your painting too early. Save the noise for right near the end.

9. HIGHLIGHTS & ACCENTS: Add thick LIGHT paint, thin dark accents, and occasional splashes of “broken” colour for VIBRANCY. Add in the noise. Fence posts telephone lines a few people on a beach, car tail lights coconuts in a tree, twinkling leaves in the sun etc.

10. EDGES: Put a dab of COMPLEMENTARY colours around edges of focal points to pop. Soften and/or cool receding edges that are not near the focal point.

That's ten but wait don't order yet.... here's a freebie!

11. STOP: It's a field study! As Robert Genn (that famous living Canadian artist – you should look at his newsletter!) once told me “ better 20% unfinished than 2% over worked.

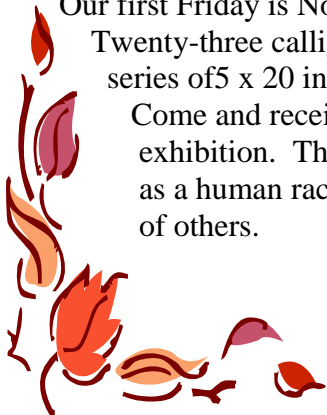

FACULTY OF EXTENSION LILLIAN NUNN SCHOLARSHIP

The Lillian Nunn scholarships are funded by the interest portion of monies bequeathed to the Faculty of Extension at the University of Alberta by the late Mrs. Lillian Nunn of Lacombe, an A.C.A.C.A. member who died in 1982.

It was Lillian Nunn's wish that her bequest be used to provide scholarships to A.C.A.C.A. members 50 years of age or older, and that the selection of scholarship winners be at the sole discretion of the Faculty of Extension. Scholarships will be awarded annually, in an amount not less than \$300.00, to assist recipients with expenses to further their art or art education.

Individuals may be awarded a Lillian Nunn Scholarship by one of two methods:

- 1) The instructors of the Faculty of Extension Fine Arts Program will submit the names and portfolios of persons who have excelled in these courses and who meet the age and A.C.A.C.A. membership requirements. These portfolios will consist of five (5) pieces of work** completed within the last 1-2 years.
- 2) A.C.A.C.A. members who meet the age requirement and have been a member for 2 consecutive years, but are not enrolled in a Faculty of Extension Fine Arts Program may apply for a scholarship by completing an application form and submitting a portfolio of five (5) pieces of work** completed within the last 1-2 years directly to the Lillian Nunn Scholarship Application do Liberal Studies, Faculty of Extension, University of Alberta, 2-200 Enterprise Square, 10230 Jasper Avenue, Edmonton, AB, T5J 4P6.
